



#### ABOUT THE SURVEY

The Collaborative on Academic Careers in Higher Education (COACHE) *Faculty Job Satisfaction Survey* was administered to all Emory full-time faculty members in the spring of 2020 in partnership with COACHE. Approximately 32% of Emory University faculty members completed the survey. However, Emory's response rate excluding the School of Medicine is 49%. Emory's participation in COACHE advances strategic priorities relating to Pillars 1 and 2 of the *university strategic framework*, and it captures many of interests identified by faculty in the *Class & Labor II* report.

#### **RESPONSE RATES** (with headcounts of respondents by self-identified group)
















Faculty were asked to identify the two best & worst aspects of working at Emory.
